DEFENSE LEADERSHIP CHANGES

From VFW.org

The Senate Committee on Armed Services held a joint confirmation hearing for the Honorable Ryan D. McCarthy to be the 24th Secretary of the Army and for the Honorable Barbara M. Barrett to be the 25th Secretary of the U.S. Air Force. Both are avid supporters of the National Defense Strategy and will continue to ensure that soldiers and their families have the resources they need to guarantee quality health care and safe housing. Ryan McCarthy is a U.S. Army Ranger and combat veteran who served in the 75th Ranger Regiment from 1997 to 2002 and was the 33rd Under Secretary of the Army. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in History from Virginia Military Institute and a Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Maryland's Robert H. Smith School of Business. Barbara Barrett is a pilot, former ambassador to Finland, and served as a member of the Aerospace Corporation's Board of Trustees. She also was a senior advisor to the U.S. Mission to the United Nations, CEO of the American Management Association, deputy administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, and vice chairman of the U.S. Civil Aeronautics Board. She earned a bachelor's degree, master's degree, and a law degree from Arizona State University.

MIA UPDATE

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced the identification of seven servicemen who were formerly missing and unaccounted-for from World War II and the Korean War. Returning home for burial with full military honors are:

- -- Navy Fireman 1st Class Lawrence E. Woods, of Texas, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which capsized after sustaining multiple torpedo hits as it was moored off Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on Dec. 7, 1941. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen.
- -- Navy Fireman 1st Class James C. Webb, of Oklahoma, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which capsized after sustaining multiple torpedo hits as it was moored off Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on Dec. 7, 1941. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen.
- -- Navy Boatswain's Mate 1st Class Arnold M. Nielsen, of California, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which capsized after sustaining multiple torpedo hits as it was moored off Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on Dec. 7, 1941. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen.

- -- Navy Chief Water Tender Francis D. Day, of New Jersey, was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which capsized after sustaining multiple torpedo hits as it was moored off Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on Dec. 7, 1941. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen.
- -- Army Air Forces Sgt. R.L. Tyler, of Texas, was a member of Headquarters Squadron, 19th Bombardment Group, when taken prisoner after the fall of Bataan in the Philippines on April 9, 1942. He reportedly died July 18-19, 1942, and was buried in a common grave at the Cabanatuan prisoner of war camp.
- -- Army Cpl. Joe T. Avant, of Mississippi, was a member of Heavy Mortar Company, 31st Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division, 31st Regimental Combat Team, engaged in intense fighting near the Chosin Reservoir in North Korea. He was reported missing and unaccounted-for on Nov. 30, 1950.
- -- Army Cpl. Autrey J. Betar, of Texas, was a member of Company A, 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division, 31st Regimental Combat Team, engaged in intense fighting near the Chosin Reservoir in North Korea. He was reported missing and unaccounted-for on Dec. 2, 1950.

TRUMP TO GRANT STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS FOR DISABLED VETERANS

President Donald Trump signed a memorandum on Wednesday to automatically cancel the student debt of tens of thousands of disabled veterans.

"Today I'm proud to announce that I am taking executive action to ensure that our wounded warriors are not saddled with mountains of student debt," Trump said in a speech at the AMVETS National Convention in Kentucky. "Nobody can complain about that, right?"

More than 25,000 disabled veterans will have their student debt forgiven, Trump said. The average balance that will be erased is around \$30,000. The president said veterans will not be required to pay federal taxes on their forgiven debt.

Disabled service members are already entitled to student debt forgiveness under the U.S. Education Department's total and permanent disability discharge option.

FROM THE POST SURGEON

To bring effective, innovative treatment to the up to 50% of Veterans entering VA health care who have Insomnia Disorder, VA has developed an online training course called "Path to Better Sleep."

In this podcast, Dr. Sarra Nazem, from Rocky Mountain MIRECC for Veteran Suicide Prevention, interviews clinical psychologists Dr. Carolyn Greene and Dr. Andrew Moon from VA's Office of Mental Health and Suicide Prevention about Insomnia Disorder, the link between Insomnia Disorder and suicide, and how VA is bringing treatment directly to Veterans through the free, self-directed, online training course "Path to Better Sleep."

If you have ever suffered insomnia you really do not need a podcast to tell you how miserable it can be and how the lack of sleep affects your whole life. Poor sleep can affect your immune system, making you more susceptible to catching colds, and even bone regeneration, which for the elderly can make recovery from a fall more difficult. And good sleep just feels better, we are less cranky, and our mood is better.

The good news is that there are treatments that work for stopping insomnia. Cognitive Behavioral Treatment for Insomnia (CBT-i) aims to improve sleep habits and behaviors by identifying and changing the thoughts and the behaviors that affect the ability of a person to sleep or sleep well.

Dr. Greene makes clear that CBT-i is not sleep hygiene, though it may borrow some techniques as a starting place. She makes it clear that CBT-i goes for beyond sleep hygiene; so, if sleep hygiene did not help, know that CBT-i is a different

treatment that does work. CBT-i has been shown to be more effective than sleep medication for the long-term on-going treatment of insomnia.

You can start now at Path to Better Sleep https://www.veterantraining.va.gov/insomnia/ which is a free online tool developed by the VA.

SERVICE OFFICER

The rendering of Military Funeral Honors is a ceremony representing the Nation's deep gratitude to those, in times of war and peace, who have faithfully defended our country. This ceremonial paying of respect is the final demonstration a grateful nation can provide to our veteran's family.

Every veteran; Soldier, Sailor, Marine, Airman, and Coast Guardsman are entitled to their proper Military Funeral Honors performed by uniformed members of the Armed Forces.


Military members in the following categories are eligible for military funeral honors: military personnel on active duty; former military members who served on active duty and were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable; members of the Selected Reserve; former members of the Selected Reserve who served at least one term of enlistment or period of initial obligated service and were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable; and former members of the Selected Reserve who were discharged due to a service related disability.

The preferred method for verifying eligibility is the DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty. If the DD Form 214 is not available, any discharge document showing other than dishonorable service can be used. Members of the Selected Reserve may not have a DD 214 unless they were mobilized under federal orders. A service member's DD 214 may be obtained by sending a request to the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, MO.

Families of eligible veterans may request funeral honors through their local funeral director. The funeral director will contact the appropriate Military Service to arrange for the funeral honors detail. For families that are not using a funeral director, contact the appropriate Military Service Coordinator.

Military units will provide, at a minimum, a two-person detail to present the core elements of the Funeral Honors Ceremony. These elements include the playing of Taps, the folding of a burial flag and the flag presentation. Under certain circumstances a rifle detail and pallbearers may be provided.

CELEBRITY VETERAN

Steinbrenner, George Michael, III, 2nd Lt, USAF

George Steinbrenner, Baseball Executive and Businessman was born in Rocky River, Ohio on July 4, 1930. He enlisted in the US Air Force in 1952 after graduating from Culver Military Academy and Williams College.

He served as an aide to the commanding general (M 5000-Special Services Officer) at the 301st Bombardment Wing, Lockbourne Air Force Base, Ohio. He was responsible for setting up athletic programs and sporting events.

After the Air Force, Steinbrenner worked in college football, as an assistant coach at Northwestern and Purdue. He also served as a graduate assistant to legendary Ohio State Buckeye football coach Woody Hayes. The Buckeyes were undefeated national champions that year, and won the Rose Bowl.

He later joined his father's financially ailing American Shipbuilding Co., where he helped affect a turn-around.

Steinbrenner bought the Cleveland Pipers of the National Industrial Basketball League in 1960. The team joined the American Basketball League the next year, and Steinbrenner made sports history by hiring John McLendon, the first African-American head coach in professional sports. He bought the New York Yankees in 1973, winning 11 American League pennants and seven world championships. The Yankees remain the most successful sports franchise in professional sports.

Steinbrenner and Elizabeth Joan Zieg and married on May 12, 1956. The have two sons Hank Steinbrenner and Hal Steinbrenner (current Managing General Partner of the Yankees), and two daughters Jessica Steinbrenner and Jennifer Steinbrenner-Swindal.

Steinbrenner died on Jul 13, 2010 at the age of 80.

2019-2020 State Commanders Project

This year's Commanders Project will focus on 3 issues that will improve the lives and wellbeing of New Jersey's veterans along with honoring our own forgotten brothers and sisters. Your donations will be used for the following programs:

MENTAL HEALTH / SUICIDE AWARENESS 40%: It is inconceivable that 22 veterans a day feel so alone and desperate that they believe committing suicide is the answer to their problems. This is not a generational or gender issue, 58.1% of veteran suicide victims are over the age of 55 and women veterans are 1.8 times more likely to commit suicide then non-veterans. I believe it is a priority for us to reduce a veteran's risk for suicide before they reach a crisis point and support those in crisis. We can't combat this alone and we must build networks of support, communication, and care across the communities where veterans live and work. To accomplish this goal, 40% of the funds raised will be used to support:

- Department wide participation of the 4th annual VFW Campaign to Change Direction on September 14, 2019, a national day of service and action to change the dialogue on mental health for veterans and their communities.
- Grants to Districts, Posts, and partnering organizations to implement support groups, awareness campaigns, mentor programs, etc., on the local level.

CONTINUED FUNDING OF THE DEPARTMENT VETERANS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 50%: Started by Commander Sarmiento, this important program lends a hand up to veterans and troops in need who do not reside in the vicinity of a VFW Post. I believe this program furthers our goal of assisting veterans before they reach a crisis point by keeping a roof over their head and food on the table.

MISSING IN AMERICA PROJECT 5%: Their mission is to locate, identify and inter the unclaimed cremains of American veterans. Locally the project is coordinated by Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 12 in Oakhurst.

GUIDING LIGHTHOUSE 5%: A transitional homeless veteran facility open to female veterans. The 24 month program includes mental health counseling, financial coaching and job skills training under the supervision of a case manager. The facility is located in Jackson N.J.

I hope you can generously support these projects and I look forward to working together to advance the VFW mission of service, representation and advocacy. *Mail all donations to:*


